

#### THE DAY - 7:25 a.m. to 2:15 p.m.



#### 23-24 Primary Offenses

- Failure to respond to questions/requests by staff
- Engaging in reckless behavior that creates a risk of injury to self or others
- Fighting that results in no injury as determined by the school administration
- Minor shoving, pushing, striking, or biting a student with no visible injury.

Offenses typically happen in classrooms and hallways. Top 3 times, 11am, 10:30am, 11:30am.

#### **Drills**

- Fire drills (2x within first 20 days and then once a month)
- Lockdown (2x a year)
- Bus Evacuation (2x a year)
- Tornado (March)

### **Our Emergency Procedures**

- Stay Put, Stay Tuned (remain/no class change)
- Shelter in Place (hazard outside/shut down intake outside air/no entry in or out)
- Secure the Building (prevents entry to building/no one in the building or out)


